Building Hospitality

Our building is a wonderful resource. It can also feel like a labyrinth when you are learning your way around. A few key locations may be helpful to you: Accessible Restrooms can be located down the main hallway from the Foyer. The Elevator is also located down the main hallway from the Foyer. The Nursery is located on the ground floor just outside the elevator. In addition to locations, there are two supports available to worship participants should they be needed: Hearing-assist devices and Large Print Hymnals can be found in the Narthex. Ushers are available and willing to assist you in finding your way or answering other questions. Wayfinding signs are also posted at all intersections throughout the building.

Welcoming Children

Just as Jesus welcomes the little children to come, so we welcome children of all ages in worship. We believe we are better when all members of God's family are included! In order to make the worship service as welcoming for our littlest ones as possible, we provide worship carts with a variety of resources to make a worship bag. Connecting with the Messiah Who... (Manger and Strings in Front of Sanctuary)

In this station you are invited to first examine the images spread out around the Sanctuary (and on the cover of this bulletin). Each image is from an artist named Scott Erickson, and each represents an interpretation of who the Messiah is or what Jesus offered in His ministry. With each image there is a tag line, "The Messiah who..." As you look at each image, ask yourself two questions: "Where am I in this image?" and "Is there a need inside of me that this image speaks to?" Once you've reflected on each image, proceed to the front of the Sanctuary.

On the front pew there are different color strings that match up with the 8 named "The Messiah who..." statements. Based on the feelings that stirred up inside of you, choose a string or multiple strings that match up with a need you have in this season. There are further instructions on the front column on what to do then. There is also a 9th color that is open for you to fill in the blank with a need not named from the images.

The Messiah Who Comforts No Sew Blankets (Narthex)

In this station we have the chance to create something that will provide comfort and warmth for others. Spread out around the tables are various "no sew blankets", which require only a series of knots to be tied to create a double-sided, warm blanket. These will be given to either our home-centered members or to some of our community partners working with those in need of comfort this season. Further instructions are at each table.

The Messiah Who Prayed For Us (Chapel)

In this station, you are invited into the Chapel for a quiet space to pray for friends, neighbors, family, or yourself. Prayers can be offered through the lighting of candles, reflection on Christ's prayer from John 17, or praying individually with Rev. Dr. Nancy Dawson. You can experience this either as a response to your time with other stations or as a stand-alone opportunity.

The Messiah Who Serves and Gives to Others (Board and Boxes in the Foyer)

Alternative Giving is our way of thinking through how and why we give gifts to friends and family during Christmas. Learn about the work of three of FPCLY's ministry partners (one local and two international) and see if a gift "in honor" of someone to a ministry he/she is passionate about is how you would like to give a gift to him/her this year.

New this year, we also have printed double-sided slips for each of our community partners. One side has a list of ways you can pray for each organization and those they serve, and the other has on-going ways you can engage or volunteer with these organizations. Members of Service & Outreach will be present to talk through various opportunities with you.

The Messiah Who Makes Room at the Table Coffee, Lemonade, Goodies, and Cookies (Foyer)

Fellowship and being in relationship with others was a main component of Christ's ministry. Enjoy some conversation, and share a cookie and lemonade with each other in between traveling to different opportunities. All are welcome at the table.

Fed by the Word that has been read, sung, proclaimed, and encountered, Inspired by the presence of God who is with us in this place and with us wherever it is we are, Let us all now depart from this time together, empowered and encouraged on the wings of the Holy Spirit who gives us the courage, strength, and hope we need each and every day.
