Building Hospitality

Our building is a wonderful resource. It can also feel like a labyrinth when you are learning your way around. A few key locations may be helpful to you: Accessible Restrooms can be located down the main hallway from the Foyer. The Elevator is also located down the main hallway from the Foyer. The Nursery is located on the ground floor just outside the elevator. In addition to locations, there are two supports available to worship participants should they be needed: Hearing-assist devices and Large Print Hymnals can be found in the Narthex. Ushers are available and willing to assist you in finding your way or answering other questions. Wayfinding signs are also posted at all intersections throughout the building.

Welcoming Children

Just as Jesus welcomes the little children to come, so we welcome children of all ages in worship. We believe we are better when all members of God's family are included! In order to make the worship service as welcoming for our littlest ones as possible, we provide worship carts with a variety of resources to make a worship bag. Worship Workshop, which typically follows the children's moment, will not be meeting this morning as all children are either participating in the Christmas Play or welcomed and encouraged to remain in Worship for the Christmas Play. Nursery is available for children ages 0 to 3. Please ask an usher if you need any assistance locating the Nursery. It is always a joy to have your children and all the wiggles, giggles, questions, noises, and insights they bring. - **2024 Contributions**. All contributions *received in the office by close of business or postmarked by December 31* will be posted to contribution statements for the 2024 tax year.
 - Electronic Contributions (credit card or draft from your checking account). You can make

 system. Should you need assistance, contact Susan by December 30 to ensure everything clears
 for this tax year.
 - Stock Gift Transfers. If you plan to transfer stock for your contribution, *please complete those right away*. It takes time for the gifts to be transferred to our accounts & clear.
- Expense Reimbursements. Please submit requests for reimbursement for any 2024 expenses by *December 30*. Any checks written after December 31 will be charged to the 2025 budget.
