Welcome to First Presbyterian Church- Lynchburg, VA

Happy New Year <u>and</u> grace and peace to you from our Lord Jesus Christ!!! It is so wonderful to be together as we worship God this morning. The beauty of God's goodness and glory surrounds us! God's mercy is new every morning! The joy of the Lord shines like the noonday sun! I pray today that you will feel and experience God's presence with you and that the rest of this day is filled with opportunities for you to live into God's light and love in all you do and with all you may be with.

Today's worship focus is Matthew 25 and more specifically God's bold vision and invitation for us to circle up and be actively engaged in the world. You might also refer to this call as one of unity and equality. Matthew 25 is full of faithful and inspiring teachings from Jesus about the Kingdom of God. Matthew 25 specifically, with its "whatever you do unto the least of these you do unto me", has become the bedrock of what the Presbyterian Church (USA), the denomination to which FPCLY is a member, calls Matthew 25 Congregations. The logo on the cover of the bulletin this morning is symbolic to the themes of building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism, and eradicating systemic poverty found at the heart of Jesus' teachings in Matthew 25. On this MLK, Jr. weekend, we might even consider the faith and action of Martin Luther King, Jr. as an example of what it means to live out Matthew 25 faithfully.

Here at First Presbyterian Church of Lynchburg, we acknowledge the many blessings God has bestowed on us and trusted us with; we acknowledge the call and responsibility we have to share those blessings with one another; we acknowledge that we don't always fulfill our call to be God's church perfectly and thus need to ask God for forgiveness; we acknowledge our need for God's grace, and the grace we can offer one another; we acknowledge the truth that we are all better together. Faith is a journey and one we believe God has called us and gifted us to walk together as God's beloved children. Welcome to this journey!

Building Hospitality
